

Robert Trott is Mr. Green and Andrew Tomazos is the young man, Ross, who is sent to do community service as part of a punishment for a vehicle accident. Mr. Green is in need of help with his meals and housework, but mostly he is recently widowed and lonely. As the play progresses, secrets are revealed and their relationship develops. Although essentially a drama, *Visiting Mr. Green* has a fair smattering of delicious humour. Two very talented actors make this a must see show.





On Sunday November 11th 2018, ARK Theatre was privileged to produce a show to commemorate the centenary of Armistice Day for the Lilydale RSL. Written for the occasion, it told stories of Yarra Valley people who served and the families that stayed behind.

A packed auditorium at Lilydale High School PAC was deeply moved by the re-enactments, many drawn from actual diary excerpts of Ralph Goode and the books by local historian, Anthony McAleer.


Throughout the show, songs of the era and a rousing singalong of old favourites had feet tapping and voices raised.

Cast were overwhelmed by the positive response they received and the realisation afterwards that actual family members of some of the people portrayed were in attendance.


